No Stallions

- ❖ All horses must be coggins tested within the current year.
- ❖ **All 4-Hers participating in any 4-H sponsored mounted activity are required to wear properly fastened ASTM/SEI approved protective headgear. Helmet use is required when mounted. This policy also extends to 4-H volunteers when they are working with youth in a 4-H volunteer role during mounted activities.**
- ❖ The Chisago County 4-H show will follow the "General Horse Show Rules" "Minnesota 4-H Horse Program Rule Book. Exception: All exhibitors must complete the required 1/2 level yearly Achievement Book along with 4-H Records Book.
- ❖ Everyone MUST wear headgear.
- ❖ Only mares and geldings will be allowed to show.
- ❖ Horses are allowed only in the designated horse building and arena area of the fairgrounds at any time.
- ❖ 4-H members show in the school grade just completed.
- ❖ When a 4-H member enters more than one horse in the horse show, the points will be counted separately on each horse and rider combination. 4-H members must specify which horse will be used in each class.
- ❖ Stall Assignment will be based on last years herdsmanship awards. 4-H members are asked to use assigned stalls and to please be flexible if the need arises for volunteer leaders to rearrange the barn due to special needs of some horses. Some families will be asked to put two horses in the same box stall.
- ❖ For safety of members, horses and spectators all horse exhibitors are expected to follow proper safety measures. This includes proper handling of horses, use of proper equipment, exercising horses only in the show ring at designated times, proper etiquette, good sportsmanship, etc.
- ❖ To be eligible for a state horse show trip a member must have: completed 6th grade, have turned in their horse ID form to the Extension Office by May 15, turned in their \$15. horse dues to the Extension Office by May 15, turned in

their Coggins test by May 15, completed ½ level in the Achievement Book, have turned in records by 11 AM the 1st day of the fair, participated in a horse interview, and attended 5 horse project activities. Each county is given a maximum number of trips to the state horse show based on a quota system related to the number of horses shown at the fair last year.

Young birds must be of a recognized breed. It may be either a male or female. This young bird must have the current year's seamless band on. Only seamless bands are acceptable. No health certificate is required but any bird that looks ill or diseased will not be allowed to be shown. It is recommended that you practice a vaccination program.
